**WOULD – WOULDN'T**

We use would to talk about probabilities and desires and also to make polite questions.

Ex: I would travel around the world if I have money

I wouldn't drink too much water if I have to travel by plane

Polite question: would you like some food?

Ex: <i>I would buy a sport car</i>		

### We use *would like to* ...



#### to offer things

Would you like a cup of coffee?



#### to invite somebody

Would you like to watch a film?



#### "I'd like" is a polite way of "I want"

I'd like to go in for athletics.

**Note:** Would you like= Do you like. But "Do you like" has a general meaning, while "Would you like" has a concrete meaning according to the situation. Compare:

Do you like to go for a walk in the evening? ----- Would you like to go for a walk tonight?

#### Choose the right variant:
