For

used to show a period of time up to present (duration)

I haven't played tennis for years.
~~I don't play tennis for years.~~
 I have lived in Chicago for six months.
~~I live in Chicago for six months.~~
 We haven't seen her for a while.

Since

from a time in the past until now (starting point)

We've lived here since 2006.
~~We live here since 2006.~~
 Turkey has been a republic since 1923.
~~Turkey is a republic since 1923.~~

Be careful

We don't use since with periods of time

I've been learning English for five years.
~~I've been learning English since five years.~~
