O.A: Identificar estructura del presente perfecto continuo

O.A2: Aplicar estructura del presente perfecto continuo y forma verbal en diferentes oraciones.

Form: have / has + been + verb + -ing

Affirmative form	You have been waiting for her for two hours.
	He has been waiting for her for two hours.
Interrogative form	Have you been waiting for her for two hours?
	Has he been waiting for her for two hours?
Negative form	You have not been waiting for her for two hours.
	He has not been waiting for her for two hours.

Use: to show that something started in the past and has continued up until now. It is often used instead of present perfect to emphasize the idea of continuity. Eg: She **has been working** here for seven years...
